Statewide Meeting Highlights Autism and Mental Health - Upstream Wellness: Supporting the Parents/Caregivers of Children Struggling Now

When: December 8, 2020 | Tue 10:00 am to 11:30 am

Format: Virtual via Zoom

On November 10, PPAL welcomed Nancy Parker, the director of Child and Teen Services at the Asperger / Autism Network (AANE) to discuss how Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD) intersects with mental health challenges. After an overview of ASD and the strengths and challenges of folks on the spectrum, she discussed various mental health challenges that can co-occur with ASD, such as anxiety and ADHD. She noted that often kids with ASD are misdiagnosed as having certain mental health challenges, when some of the common traits of ASD are mistaken for indicators of conditions such as OCD or bipolar disorder, and provided helpful coping strategies for kids and parents. Parents applauded the presentation, saying that it "provided a wealth of information and knowledge to assist kids that may otherwise be misunderstood," and describing Nancy as "engaging, upbeat and passionate about these topics." Be sure to join PPAL for our next statewide meeting on December 8! This upcoming webinar meant only for parents / caregivers/family members/family partners of children with behavioral health needs. Gain critical information and support during this time of public health crisis.

About the speakers:

- * Annemarie Matulis understands what families are dealing with when a child exhibits extreme behaviors, self-harm, suicidal ideation, and more. Annemarie wants to dismiss the myths to help find support for families. That includes upstream wellness for caregivers as well as honest information and real-time supports. Annemarie is the Executive Director for Bristol County Regional Coalition for Suicide Prevention, a Suicide Prevention Consultant for MA DPH for the Greater Taunton Area, and the Director for A Voice at the Table an international, grassroots movement for the family/friends impacted by the suicidal crisis of a loved one (struggling with suicidal thoughts, NSSI (non-suicidal self-injury and/or a suicidal attempt).
- * Meagan Manas will continue the conversation with information about MassSupport. MassSupport provides confidential (unidentified) support for individuals in English, Spanish, Haitian Creole, and Portuguese. MassSupport is a division of Riverside and is funded by FEMA. Meagan Manas is an Outreach Crisis Counselor for MassSupport 's Central Massachusetts region. In addition to helping residents of Central MA cope with the effects of the pandemic, Meagan is working on her final year of a master's degree in Mental Health Counseling. She is also the pastor of the Presbyterian Church in Clinton, MA, a diverse and affirming multi-cultural congregation.

Celebrate IDEA's 45TH Anniversary Congress enacted the Education for All Handicapped Children Act, also known as the EHA, in 1975 to support states and localities in protecting the rights of, meeting the individual needs of, and improving the results for infants, toddlers, children, and youth with disabilities and their families. WHA was modeled after M.G.L. Chapter 766, the first non-categorical law guaranteeing all children the right to a free appropriate public education. This landmark law's name changed to the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act, or IDEA, in a 1990 reauthorization. Before EHA, many children were denied access to education and opportunities to learn. In 1970, U.S. schools educated only one in five children with disabilities, and many states had laws excluding certain students, including children who were deaf, blind, emotionally disturbed, or had an intellectual disability.
