National Family Caregivers Month – celebrated each November – is a time to recognize and honor family caregivers across the country, a time to celebrate the contributions of caregivers and provide them with tools that they need. Across Massachusetts, more than 18,000 families are caring for a family member with an intellectual or developmental disability in the home. More than 9,000 of these family members are adults.

The Department of Developmental Services has joined with The Arc of Massachusetts to provide information, resources, support, and strategies to help caregivers stay strong and resilient.

This year's theme, **Caregiving Around the Clock**, certainly brings light to how caregivers have worked tirelessly in providing for loved ones during the pandemic. This series will begin in November and extend through March 2021. Future topics for February and March are forthcoming. Many sessions will also be recorded and made available on demand via YouTube if you are unable to attend.

What's the difference between

Telehealth and Telemedicine?

Telehealth uses electronic information and telecommunication to support and promote long distance clinical health care, patient and professional health-related education, public health, and health administration. **Telemedicine** is health care delivered virtually. It's the interaction between a patient and a clinician via telecommunication to support diagnosis, treatment, or disease prevention.

Examples of what services are provided

- Video conferencing
 - Real-time, two-way interaction that supports health care services
- "Store and forward"
 - Digital images, pictures, video, or text that was recorded and stored before being sent
- Remote patient monitoring (RPM)
 - Health and medical data, such as blood glucose or blood pressure. Technologies need different levels of intervention by patient and doctor. Data can be sent as needed or on a predetermined schedule.
- Mobile health (mHealth)
 - Using mobile devices, tablets, or phones to send health care information

- Doctor's appointment using telecommunication
- Primary care and specialist teleconsultation
- · Telediagnosis and treatment plan
- Telepsych/behavioral assessment
- Follow-up appointment
- Medication management
- · Management of chronic conditions


Scott Klumb, an award-winning Colorado filmmaker, takes viewers on his very own journey to bring awareness to late diagnosis autism. In a year where unpredictability prevailed, Autism: One Man's Journey has gained entry into 8 film festivals in 2020! Scott's film continues to gain international attention with its most recent entry into the Sydney, Australia "Lift Off" film festival. We hope that 2021 will bring us together again in person, but until then we are happy to bring this film to you in the safety and comfort of your own home. Your ticket purchase will help Scott continue to make important films like this one. We would like to thank you in advance for your support! Currently, an unprecedented number of autistic young people will be making the transition to adulthood. But what if you are autistic and never diagnosed as a child? What if you are entering adulthood without the benefit of early diagnosis, intervention, and support? Autism: One Man's Journey is a documentary and memoir about Scott Michael Klumb, an award-winning filmmaker diagnosed with autism at age 23. Scott takes viewers on a journey, wanting to bring awareness to the issues related to late diagnosis, and not understanding what was "wrong" with him for most of his life. This is a story of hardship, perseverance, and hope. It is a story of inspiration including Scott's personal interview with Dr. Temple Grandin, one of the world's most accomplished and well-known adults with autism. Scott filmed, edited, and produced this inspiring autobiographical film with the hope to reassure late diagnosis autistics that they are not alone, there is support for them too, and that it is possible to connect with people who care. Showing how pushing himself to address challenging situations and emotions, Autism: One Man's Journey proves that an autistic person can hone their strengths and abilities to create a meaningful life and career.
